All first Costa (MC I loved listening to your hilarious album. The word mindfulness is totally overused and over-quoted these days and I'm glad you're putting a new meaning to it. Are you a woman on a mission to reinstate freedom to the soul? It sounds very hippy and love it.

is that culture is becoming extreme and is rampant at it everywhere. It just tells us to be grateful and happy. It also makes negativity something to be allergic to, when actually negativity is good. There's a natural part of the human condition that's negative and we are designed to feel uncomfortable. We're not designed to always feel happy. If we were always so happy we would be diluting ourselves. It's a delusion. It's like saying that negativity doesn't exist. And for me, becoming a mum, has meant that I can't get myself out of this hole of feeling overwhelmed. Venting is so much healthier. By being more honest about how we feel we can better connect with like-minded people who can see how you really are. When mums can do that, they can connect and support each other. We're living at a time when parents are trying to be perfect and there's a bit of a disconnect.

HC. How did you come up with the idea for the album and do you actually walk the talk?

Oh, definitely. The idea came while I was studying about life coaching for another project. But I had my son on one side and that made me see things in a different way. This really helped me embrace how I would genuinely feel. By combining that with all the comedy that I've done, I could create a new version of mindfulness. That got me quite excited. I'm prouder of this than anything else I have done so far, because it can help other mums.

We I could have benefited from this album when my son was a baby because at times I felt surrounded by all these perfect mums while having the most imperfect child. I often felt lonely and I set up the London Mums' network to have a forum to open up about issues like that. A real group of opinionated mums as opposed to the so-called 'Stepford Wives'. Now, I'm up to my second bout of rebellious mumsy behaviour and I want to be a rock mum. My vocal coach told me that singing in a rock band has the same neurological effect of meditation and mindfulness. So here I am gigging with real rockers.

How do you think this album will change the attitude to show-off perfection?

The only time I dropped the c-bomb on the album is when I talk about finding a tribe of like-minded women and avoiding the fake ones on Instagram. I just want to offer an alternative to that idea of perfection. I embrace the idea of imperfection and see perfection like nicotine. Whether it's about trying to lose your baby weight really quickly or competitive mums, it's all so exhausting. There are millions of women out



there who are willing to be honest and do things differently. All I can hope is that after listening to my album any mum will be able to un-f*** themselves from the prison of perfection."

MC: My London Mums' tribe is honest and open. But it may be because it is a multicultural and multiracial community.

OL: You probably attract people that are like you.

MC: You're currently turning the album into a live show with dates and venues to be announced shortly.

OL: Yes. We hear about toxic masculinity, i.e. men struggling to be vulnerable. There's also this notion of toxic femininity out there, which is feeding women subconscious messages. The deeper message behind the album is that women need to embrace their rage and not to worry about being 'f****able', and being likable. We need to allow ourselves to be angry because that's a very forward-thinking emotion. I've read diverse books about female anger and I'm expanding on those feeds in the live show.

Warning! Mums, make sure you take a little time to yourselves, but the album is so X-rated that tracks are not to be listened to in front of the kids!

NEW BOOK BY AWARD-WINNING ROYAL CORRESPONDENT ROBERT JOBSON MARKS THE BIRTH OF PRINCE HARRY AND MEGHAN MARKLE'S FIRST CHILD, ARCHIE HARRISON MOUNTBATTEN

Tea at the Ritz London is always a pleasure, especially if the occasion is as glamorous as the launch party for a new book about Royals. Our Royal Baby is an interesting publication because it is not a biography but a very visual book created in collaboration with commercial partners and brands such as the world's purest baby wipes WaterWipes (who invited me along) that have been carefully selected by the Duke and Duchess of Sussex to become patrons of their baby journey. Best-selling, award-winning author Robert Jobson, who has chronicled the story of the Windsors for the past 30 years, is a smart and witty man so it was lovely to listen to his anecdotes involving young naughty Prince Harry. Robert is the royal editor of the Evening Standard in the UK, as well as the leading royal contributor for major television networks in the US, Australia and New Zealand.

The commemorative publication charts Prince Harry and Meghan Markle's journey from romance and engagement, through to marriage and new parenthood. This fully illustrated, beautifully designed hardback book heralds the arrival of the newest addition to the House of Windsor, and reflect on the current state of the British Royal Family and the place that it holds in the hearts of the nation.

Here are a few funny stories told by Robert Jobson over tea.

Being a Royal Correspondent has been a fantastic journey. I started in the Nineties as a young Royal Correspondent and covered all sorts of stories: I have covered all sort of stories: The dramas of the Queen, Charles and Diana's story. It was an amazing time. Then of course 1992, which the Queen famously called her Annus Horribilis. The last few weeks have been tough for her with all these allegations about the private jets. But it's nowhere near as difficult as it was for her in the '90s. Meghan has brought the whole warrior story which has not really been seen since the days of late princess Diana. Her global appeal is demonstrated by the photographic world. The interest in Meghan is so high that the price of photographs is huge compared to that of images of the Royal family prior to that. She has a really strong appeal and that's because she has a warmth about her.

I have known Prince Harry for a long time. He was always a troublesome little chap. When he was at six or seven, he loved dressing up in army fatigues. He didn't want anything else but being a soldier and he would go up to one of the police officers, and ask: Can I have your a radio? I need a job to do.' And so he gave him radio and said: 'okay, go to the police station, the police box and then report from there.' So Harry would wander off. Once he disappeared and went to his aunt Lady Jane and reported from there. About half an hour past the officer suddenly remembered that Harry hadn't returned. There was a full scale alert and they went rushing out into Kensington High Street and there he was, this little boy with his radio outside the Palace. None of these stories, by the way, made it into the press. Another time little Harry had gone missing completely and no one knew where it was. And there was a proper security alert they thought had been kidnapped. He was found asleep in the garden.

Recently he has done a brilliant job with the Invictus games. And his work with HIV AIDS campaigns has continued – that is the legacy of his mother – and the work he does with his charity across Africa is hugely important. Unfortunately, in the last few months he seems to have lost a little bit of the common touch. I'm sure I'll come back. He's a very charming man. But he's probably been a little over-protective as a new dad, but you can understand that."



Downton Abbey The Movie: Chatting with Academy Award winning Julian Fellowes and actor Hugh Bonneville

After six years of waiting, the *Downton Abbey* movie, written by Julian Fellowes, is finally here. The movie picks up not too long after the spries ended. Time-wise, it's nearly eight months after. The beloved Crawleys and their intrepid staff prepare for the most important moment of their lives. A royal visit from the King and Queen of England will unleash scandal, romance and intrigue that will leave the future of Downton hanging in the balance.

I was delighted to meet the entire cast and filmmakers at the London press conference as well as to chat to creator Julian Fellowes and actor Hugh Bonneville.

Q: The idea that the changing of the guard and the passing of the baton between the more senior members of the house and the younger members of the house, how important was that in the writing process for a continuation into the future?

lian Fellowes: The very important part for the survival of these houses is always dependent on the older generation, knowing when it's time to let the next generation come in. When they don't do that and they hang on, the heir finally gets sick when they're already 68. This means they're too old to make the changes and do the work that needs to be done. I wanted to make it clear that Mary was going to be put in charge while she still had a level of energy and attack to get on with it. Even she has her moments of doubt as to whether she really wants to do it. But if she had not been allowed to get it before 60, she wouldn't have done it. And I suppose that was the point that I was endeavouring to make by making it clear that she's in charge and that Robert and Cora have the grace to accept that they must now step back and let the next generation get in.

Q: Everybody loves Lady Violet and would like to know how that character was born and whether she is based in any way on a real person.

Julian Fellowes: She was based on my grandfather's eldest sister whom I knew very well. He died in the Great War at 29, but his elder sister lived on. I was 21 and she was very autocratic and very tough on all the rest of us, but tough on herself as well to keep traditions going. In that sense, the character of Lady Violet was based on her. These strong women had been in charge during the war, while the men went off to the front, and were holding families together. That generation went through incredibly tough things. Q: How much was the screenplay for the movie filtered through the current political situation in Britain?

Julian Fellowes: Part of the popularity of the show is that it doesn't do that. There's a sense of longing for a time when people experience a greater sense of the community or a greater connection to those who aren't like them and don't live like them. These characters have universal appeal. It's a family in which there are rivalries and jealousies and then affection. These stories speak to everyone.

Q: The series is very successful and the movie extremely anticipated. Can you talk a little bit about the move from TV to the big screen.

Julian Fellowes: In the series, not everyone involved expects to have a major story every week. They probably have two or three during the whole process. Not every story is completed every week. Some of them go through two or three episodes, some last the whole season. In the movie, everyone who appears in it must have a reason for being there and all of those narratives must be completed and resolved within the film. You can't say to people that we're stopping this story here and you can come and see the continuation in the next film. It doesn't work like that. So, the structure was altered in that way. We also wanted people to recognise the series they loved within the film and not be disappointed. It still had to feel like you were coming back to the same place. Obviously, all the actors understood the characters they were playing because they created them. Our job was to make it more cinematic and to find a central unifying subject – the Royal visit – that would allow us to plausibly increase the scale and fill a larger screen.

Another big challenge was to get 20 leading actors to be available in the same month, same year and in the same place. As to whether we've done that successfully, it's not for us to judge.

Q: Downton Abbey is without a doubt the biggest period drama that has come out of Britain. In your mind, how





far timewise is the storyline of these characters gone? Have you already thought of taking these characters through the Second World War or beyond that? Are there going to be more movies? People really want to know this.

Julian Fellowes: I don't know. We've covered a timeframe of 15 years between 1912 and 1927 and we have done that over the space of 10 years in a fairly slow manner. The difference between actual time and fictional time, is not very great. Making the actors age 60 years, would not be credible. I wouldn't take them 20 years forward. But whether there's another bite to come out of it, who knows...

Q: Hi Hugh! We met at the junket for the Paddington movie a couple of years ago. Referring to both films you've done in recent times, do you prefer playing the Earl of Grantham or Mr Brown? Also, Allen Leech earlier suggested that your sexy calves are the defining moment for this shoot. What do you take away from this?

Hugh Bonneville: It's the same performance, it's just different costumes. The dad tries to make his way with family. One involves a furry bear, the other involves Michelle Dockery. I appreciate both projects equally. In terms of my calves, they are magnificent – Allen is completely right. And because I get to show them in the film, I think they will be a feature of the fan memorabilia for the years to come.

Q: How was it wearing women's clothes in Paddington? And the period fashion that you wear in Downton Abbey. Which one do you prefer? Hugh Bonneville: I did try and get into the women's clothes in Downton Abbey as well. But the director was a little reluctant so that scene did not hit the cutting room floor. The fashion, particularly for the women of Downton Abbey, is wonderful and I'm very envious. I would have loved to wear one of those frocks.

Q: What was it like meeting 'King George' for real?

Hugh Bonneville: It was nearly as exciting as meeting Shirley MacLaine for real but slightly less glamorous. When Shirley turned up on her first day of filming, it was her arrival, she wanted to kiss everybody on both cheeks and she was told that she could not do that. Then she asked, can I hug Carston? We had to tell her: But Shirley, we are English, they are servants. (giggles)

Q: You have a few high-profile fans out there...

Hugh Bonneville: I can remember when Elizabeth McGovern and I were in Washington DC at a lunch once and met John Kerry, who was the Secretary of State then. He said that he'd been recovering from a bad back and had insomnia. His wife picked up the Downton Abbey DVD boxset which he watched from 4 am to midday. He was rather hooked. There's another White House connection. When we were invited to the American Ambassador's residence in London to celebrate Thanksgiving, a letter from Michelle Obama was there waiting to greet us because she's a big fan of our show. On another occasion, we did actually go to the White House and she said to us that the characters have become like friends to her.



LASER HAIR REMOVAL

I have been removing my body hair all over since I was 16 and I can honestly say that it is a big hassle, often painful and, more importantly, time consuming. These days the promise of living body hair-free is alluring and real. Laser hair removal is the option that seems to offer a more permanent solution to getting rid of body hair. I recently went to a consultation at the Pulse Light Clinic (www.pulselightclinic.co.uk) London and I have found out the following.

1. Have no fear: laser hair removal is not painful

Laser hair removal uses laser light pulses to selectively destroy hair follicles by targeting the melanin (colour) in them. The pigment in the hair follicle absorbs the laser's light pulse, which damages the follicle enough to significantly retard hair regrowth. Laser hair removal is not electrolysis which works by directing an electric current into each individual hair follicle. It is painful and time consuming. Hair removal Lasers, on the other hand, can target a large amount of hairs in one go, in a much less painful manner. You may find the procedure a bit hot and sharp at first on the face which is more sensitive but nothing unbearable.

2. The process is lenghty

After an initial consultation to check the suitability of your complexion and hair type, you are provided with a plan. It usually takes two or three weeks after your first treatment to see a difference, and 8-12 treatments to get a permanent result. If you have one appointment per month, it will take one year for visible changes. The appointments cannot be missed because regularity is crucial to the success of this procedure. The hair follicles grow at different stages, so you need to all of them get removed. If you are only removing your facial hair, each appointment only takes 20 minutes.

3. Skin Preparation ahead of the treatments

You need to use a trim or shave hair in the area to be treated before you undergo the laser treatment and make-up obviously needs to be removed as well. You also need to avoid scrubbing your skin for at least two days before and after the treatment.

4. Things to avoid

Plucking, waxing or bleaching hair have to be avoided if you start laser hair treatments because they can be impediments to the whole process.

5. Benefits of Laser hair removal

Apart from clearer, smoother skin and permanent hair reduction, laser hair removal's benefits include helping to reduce ingrowing hairs (a frustrating side effect of hair removal) and improve skin irritation. Apparently, the treatment encourages hair to grow straight. This hair removal device is suitable for all skin types and hair types. The hair just needs to be dark enough to drawn the laser.

Tapas lunch at Federal Café

Evocative Liberty-style restaurant, centrally located offering a variety of contemporary tapas. (Tel: 960 617 596 http://federalcafe.es/valencia)

Valencia Family Tour



The guided walk called Valencia Family Tour to explore the city including activities and games tailored for children, is designed for visitors spending only a few days in Valencia who want to explore with kids the most emblematic sites of the old town,

such as the Lonja de la Seda (Silk Exchange) and the Cathedral.

The Holv Grail site

You don't have to be religious, but only curious to see what is

believed to be the Holy Grail itself. Many historians believe it to be the real deal (the chalice belonged to the Spanish Queen Urraca, and is believed that was made sometime between 200BC and 100AD). Even the Pope has given his blessings on behalf of the Catholic Church!

The City of Arts and Science

This futuristic-looking location, used to film Disney's Tomorrowland starring George Clooney, is the work of Valencia's own architect Santiago Calatrava. The colossal structure houses an IMAX cinema (situated in the Hemisfèric), the Oceanogràfic – Europe's largest aquarium, interactive educational exhibits in the Príncipe Felipe Science Museum and the avantgarde opera house - Palau de les Arts Reina Sofía. Valencia Beach

Marina de Valencia hosts some of the city's most important landmarks, shops, terraces, restaurants with spectacular views, as well as a children's park, the Superyachts



Berthing with its amazing yachts and boats. Just a few metres away are the beaches of El Cabanyal (Las Arenas) and La Malvarrosa, next to the attractive Paseo Marítimo promenade. Paella Making at Barraca de Toni Montoliu www.barracatonimontoliu.com Outside Valencia at the farm Barraca de Toni Montoliu, we collected vegetables from the fields before making an authentic Valencian paella under the expert guidance of owner Toni himself. Children can take a tour around the vegetable gardens in a horse-drawn cart, visit a Barraca museum (the typical houses of the region), an exhibition of carts and agricultural tools from the 19th and 20th centuries (60-90 minutes), and go on a donkey ride.

CHRISTMAS IN TUSCANY By Bita Kobrak

Take advantage of the school holidays to go to Tuscany and let a Tuscan chef prepare a traditional Christmas lunch feast for your family to remember. No shopping, no cooking and no washing up! The delicious food, the welcoming attitude and inclusion of children makes Tuscany so special for families. Over Christmas, there are less tourists and Italians love walking around the streets, piazzas and Christmas markets (Arezzo being a good one to visit).

The festive season kicks off with the 'Immacolata' (a public holiday in Italy celebrating the Immaculate Conception) on December 8th and finish with the Epiphany on January 6th, when an ugly old lady called 'Befana' leaves gifts for good children and lumps of coal for the naughty ones. My Mum was from Sicily and there the naughty kids received a stick in their stockings! La Befana is awaited by Italian kids almost more than Father Christmas. Her arrival marks the end of the festive season.

A Tuscan Christmas lunch feast

Christmas lunch starts off with chicken liver or tomato Crostini. The meal continues with the 'primo' (first course) which is a pasta dish such as homemade ravioli stuffed with either meat or ricotta and spinach or 'Crespelle alla Fiorentina', pancakes stuffed with ricotta and spinach. They are made like normal pancakes, then they are stuffed with ricotta and spinach and coated with Bechamel and tomato sauce, grated Parmesan cheese and baked in the oven.

The main course is roast pork flavoured with herbs (rosemary, sage, garlic) and white wine poured over it in the oven to keep it moist. It is served with potatoes and seasonal vegetables. Desserts include Panettone, Panforte, Ricciarelli biscuits (almond flavoured biscuits which originate from Siena). Finally, liqueur or Vin Santo (sweet dessert wine) to aid digestion! You can even dip Cantucci biscuits in the Vin Santo.

New year's eve's dinner (II Cenone) is normally a fish-based meal including a plate of lentils, eaten at midnight to bring luck (lentils symbolise money in Italy).

Where to stay

At Villa Radicata, situated in the medieval village of Caprese Michelangelo, we will prepare your Christmas lunch or all meals, so you can really relax and enjoy your holiday rather than doing the same chores that you do at home. We also offer Wine Tasting experiences, cooking or pasta making lessons.

Materials

- coloured or pattern paper approx. 15 x 15cm
- white paper approx. 10 x 15.cm
- paper scraps
- bakers twine for hanging
- gem (optional)

Tools

- pen
- scissors
- glue stick

Step 1

Concertina fold your square piece of paper with approximately

0.5mm folds. I added some red

strips to the white paper for effect – but you can leave them plain too! Fold the wide paper in concertina shape along the 10cm edge.

Step 2

Fold both concertinas in half – as neatly as you can.

Step 3 Then glue the white paper wings to the body.



Step 4

Add your bakers twine for hanging (and it also secures the shape a little more.

Glue the bottom of the angel skirt together.





Step 5

To make your face, you will need a circle in skin tone colour and a strip of paper. Glue the strip of paper to the top of the head.

Step 6

Then fold down behind the head on both sides. Trim to a desired length. And add your facial features with pen!

Step 7

Glue the head to the top of the angel body and add any embellishments such a gems, bows or sequins.
