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Music Star! Esther Abrami: A MODERN MUSE IN CLASSICAL MUSIC

Esther Abrami, a rising star in classical music, brings a fresh perspective to film soundtracks, enticing young enthusiasts into the genre. Recently, I witnessed her spellbinding performance at London's LSOO

St. Luke's, where her talent was matched by her grace and warmth. At just 26, Esther's journey has been extraordinary, with education at esteemed institutions and accolades including the 'Social Media Superstar' at the Global Awards. Her latest album, "Cinéma," is a testament to her artistry.



Q: Congratulations on the release of your new album, "Cinéma"! Could you share with me what inspired you to create this collection of film and TV scores, classical music, and anime hits?

EA: Thank you! What inspired me is the notion that a movie's soundtrack transcends musical boundaries. It's a tool to introduce classical and orchestral music to a broader audience.

Q: You've mentioned that you carefully curated each piece on the album to reflect your background, heritage, and support for women in music. Could you tell me more about how these elements influenced your song selections?

EA: When I record, I aim for pieces with a personal connection to my life. Being French, I included tracks from beloved French films. Q: "Naruto: Alone Theme" is the first single from "Cinéma". What drew you to this particular piece, and how did you approach reimagining it with a philharmonic orchestra?

EA: I loved anime as a teenager and realised the music from Naruto had never been recorded for violin and orchestra. Hearing it come to life with a full orchestra was truly amazing.

Q: The album includes unique arrangements of both blockbuster hits and beloved classics. Can you share some insights into your creative process when adapting these iconic pieces for violin and orchestra?

EA: It's a delicate process to arrange existing music. You must create something new while preserving the original magic. Having a supportive team and receiving feedback are crucial.



Q: Two of the pieces on the album feature different types of instrumentation, one with a loop station and another with a guitarist. How did you decide on these unique approaches, and what was it like working with different musicians for these arrangements?

EA: I aim to give each recording a personal touch. The loop station idea came to me while experimenting with my violin. It was important to create something different for "Amélie Poulain". For the duet with guitar, we wanted a fresh take on a classic piece, so we spent hours in the studio exploring new possibilities.

Q: You recorded "Cinéma" at the legendary Smecky Studios in Prague. Could you tell me about your experience working in such a renowned studio with the City of Prague Philharmonic Orchestra? **EA:** It was incredible! Recording in such an iconic space was highly inspiring. Facing a big orchestra there for my album was a surreal moment.

Q: The album also includes world premiere recordings by Oscar-winning composers Anne Dudley and Rachel Portman. Can you share some insights into collaborating with these accomplished artists?

EA: Anne Dudley and Rachel Portman are inspiring figures in their field. Collaborating with them was a privilege. As classical musicians, we often work with composers long gone, so working with living legends is truly special.

Q: "Cinéma" seems to be a rich tapestry of music spanning genres, cultures, and generations. Is there a particular piece on the album that holds a special significance for you, and if so, could you tell me why?



EA: "Zeyn" holds a special place in my heart. It's from the movie "Capharnaüm" and the story deeply touched me. The music, composed by Khaled Mouzanar, is heart-wrenching.

Q: Your career has seen remarkable achievements, from winning the 'Social Media Superstar' category at the Global Awards to being featured in Classic FM's '30 under 30 Classical Artists to Watch'. How do you balance your online presence with your musical pursuits?

EA: It's demanding, but I love creating content for social media. It's about being exceptionally organised to manage it all alongside my rigorous practice routine.

Q: You've become known for your efforts in addressing the gender gap and stereotypes in the music industry. Can you tell me about your work with 'Her Ensemble' and what you hope to achieve with this initiative?





EA: The 'Her Ensemble' initiative is close to my heart. It's about supporting women in a field that can be challenging. Working with a team of incredible women where we're heard and valued is a rare and precious experience.

Q: Your podcast, 'Women in Classical', showcases outstanding women musicians and composers. Could you share a bit about the inspiration behind this project and what you hope listeners will take away from it?

EA: I believe conversations can drive change. 'Women in Classical' provides a space to discuss topics often considered taboo. Hearing advice from seasoned women in the industry can be incredibly beneficial and make others feel less alone in their experiences.

Ask The Expert! The Potential of Play: HOW OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY FOSTERS CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT

Childhood is a critical period for growth and development, because it's where the physical, emotional, cognitive, and social skills begin to take shape. These are the skills that kids will carry forward as they grow up and lead successful, fulfiling lives. Sometimes, kids need a little extra support in mastering these skills, and that's where Occupational therapy (OT) can help. Particularly at a young age, early intervention plays a vital role in helping kids feel more comfortable, more autonomous, and more self-confident.

In general, occupational therapy serves as a vital support system to empower your child's development. It plays a pivotal role in refining fine and gross motor skills, and in shaping the foundation for their physical abilities. Through engaging in age-appropriate activities, OT can offer your children an opportunity to enhance essential skills like handwriting, utensil use, balance, and coordination.

But there's more to occupational therapy than just movement. For example, through interactive games and creative exercises, OT can help your child become a better problem solver, enhance their memory skills, and improve their concentration-all while having fun!

Something I often see in kids who come to OT is that, for many of these children, managing emotions can sometimes be a challenge. So, by introducing a safe and accepting space for your child to express and understand their feelings, OT can help your child learn valuable emotional regulation skills, helping them navigate complex emotions and find balance.

Social skills are another vital aspect of your child's growth, and occupational therapy provides a friendly environment to nurture them. These are typically enhanced through group activities, where children learn to communicate, collaborate, and empathise with peers, laying the groundwork for meaningful friendships and positive social interactions.

And last but not least, if your child struggles with sensitivities to things like loud noises or different textures, occupational therapy can offer specialised activities to gently increase their comfort levels and help them feel more at ease.

Since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, published studies have highlighted that mainstream



learners have a need for and can benefit from complementary fine and gross motor exercises. So, after twenty five years as a licensed therapist and OT

instructor, I founded Hands On Fun Occupational Therapy (HOFOT for short). At HOFOT, we work to promote healthy, age appropriate skill development in children using techniques backed by science! In particular, HOFOT offers supplementary programs to assist children at a preschool age meet their developmental milestones through tailored playtime activities that are comprehensive, adaptable, and-most importantly-centred around the mission: healing through play.

Play really is the language of children, and it's through play that they explore the world, learn about themselves, and develop crucial skills. By using engaging and motivating play-based strategies, occupational therapy effectively captures children's attention and maintains their active engagement throughout the therapeutic process. These playful activities not only serve as enjoyable experiences but also provide a natural context that closely resembles real-life situations, allowing children to practice and generalise crucial skills in a meaningful and practical manner.

This approach also helps foster a calm and stress-free environment, which is crucial to help kids overcome any therapy jitters they may feel. A relaxed setting enables children to express themselves more comfortably, which facilitates effective communication and enables therapists to address their needs more effectively. And last but not least, this play-oriented methodology extends its impact by working to seamlessly integrate the skills they acquire during therapy into their daily routines. In my experience, I've learned that by encouraging parents and caregivers to play an active role in their child's OT, they can not only promote consistency in their child's new behaviors, but also expedite their progress, which really creates a holistic and effective path toward the child's overall development and well-being.

Occupational therapy has evolved into an essential cornerstone of childhood development, it's crucial that we continue finding ways to help children overcome challenges and reach their full potential. Through our work, 'Hands on Fun OT' exemplifies this visionary approach to occupational therapy by combining evidence-based practices with the joy of play-based learning.

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Star Mum! Izzy Judd Shares Her Secrets to Balancing Motherhood, a Music Career and Wellness

In this exclusive interview, I explore the life of Izzy Judd, a musician with a rich heritage in melody. Raised in a musically accomplished family in Hertfordshire, Judd was always surrounded by her three older brothers, all skilled musicians and music was the fluent language in her household.

Embarking on her violin journey at the age of five, Judd's passion became the guiding force of her musical odyssey, which led her through esteemed institutions such as the Royal College of Music in London and Chetham's School of Music in Manchester.

However, life's symphony was not without its challenges. In 2014, Judd confronted the heartbreak of a miscarriage, a testament to her resilience. Yet, in early 2015, a new melody began as she embarked on the challenging journey to motherhood through IVF. Judd's narrative is one of unwavering determination, evident both in her musical pursuits and in her deeply personal journey through family. Accompanying her on this journey is her husband, Harry Judd, an English musician, dancer and author, best known as the drummer for the band McFly.



Balancing a career, parenting, and being married to a rock star can be quite demanding. Could you share some of your go-to strategies for maintaining a harmonious family life amidst such a busy schedule?

"I think for many mums, the juggle of parenting and having a career is challenging. I'm always working on planning in time for myself, and reminding myself that the relentless tasks can wait! My moment of calm is a yoga class, playing my violin, walking or doing my tapestry. I've also joined the mum choir at school which I love. When I have done something for myself I always find it helps everyone as I'm a calmer mum."

Given your experiences, what would be your top piece of advice for fellow parents who are striving to balance their careers, family life and personal wellness?

"Sleep is my go-to, there is nothing more needed than a good night's sleep to take care of your personal wellness. Balancing my career and family life is always a work in progress but I try to remind myself to stop and question what my priorities and self-values are." How has your background in music influenced your journey as an artist, and how do you think it has shaped your creative process?

"Having grown up surrounded by music, it has influenced me in every possible way. Discipline and the ability to focus have stuck with me. Even though my career has moved in different directions, the basic skills I have learned have helped me on whichever road I've taken, especially creatively."

Collaborating with your husband Harry, how do you balance the personal and professional aspects of your relationship when working on music projects together?

"Harry and I met on the McFly Wonderland tour in 2005, so keeping a professional and personal relationship has been with us since the beginning. It has always felt very natural and we love being able to work on projects together (it's also nice to be able to spend time together!)"

Your memoir, "Dare to Dream", beautifully touches on your experiences and emotions. How has this journey influenced your music, and do you find it cathartic to express yourself through your songs?

"Music has always been the glue that connects me back to me, in traumatic



moments and happy moments. It is a language that doesn't need words so I use it as a way to express myself. It is where I feel most at home and most me. During our fertility struggles I found it difficult to listen to music as it was too emotional at times, however when I was pregnant with my daughter Lola, I used to listen to 'Half the World Away' by Aurora through ear buds on my tummy and to this day this song soothes us both."

Parenthood is a significant aspect of both your and Harry's lives. How has being parents influenced the themes and emotions conveyed in your music?

"For me personally, I started to pick up my violin a lot more when Lockie was born. He used to sit in his bouncer looking up at me whilst I played him lullabies, I was amazed how quickly he stopped crying and how my shoulders dropped with relaxation. It is very easy to lose yourself in motherhood, reconnecting with something you love can be so powerful."

Your advocacy for mental health and well-being is admirable. How do you

use your platform and music to raise awareness and support for mental health issues?

"I've always spoken very openly about my struggles with anxiety because it is a part of who I am. It also gives me comfort to talk about it and for people to also share their experiences. We all feel better when we feel less alone. Mindfulness has been an anchor for me, so when I play my violin, I feel very present and grounded."

Looking ahead, what exciting projects or ventures can we expect from you in the near future, and how do you envision your musical journey progressing?

"I'm excited to be releasing "Moments" which is a collection of songs arranged for violin and piano. It felt amazing to be in the studio recording and it really helped my confidence stepping out of being mum for a little while. I have been so grateful to the community on Instagram for supporting me over the years so this is a little something I would like to give back to them."

As a mother, how do you prioritise natural and scientifically backed wellness solutions for your children? Are there any specific products you find particularly helpful?

A LONDON NANNY NOW COSTS £43K AMID SOARING DEMAND FROM FAMILIES WHO CAN'T GET NURSERY PLACES

Parents weighing up childcare options may find costs and competition for nannies soaring amid a reduction in the number of nursery places.

London nannies have had an 8% pay rise in the past year, with the average annual salary now £42,848, equivalent to £3,571 per month. But the biggest rises have been seen across the Home Counties and Greater London, where nanny salaries are up 14% to £40,300, or £3,358 per month. That's according to the latest figures published by Nannytax, the largest and longest-running nanny payroll provider in the UK.

A breakdown of earnings in the capital reveals nannies in Central London earn the most, at £18.58 per hour, while nannies in North West London earn the least at £15.51. Looking at Greater London and the Home Counties, Buckinghamshire nannies earn the most at £15.91 per hour, while Essex nannies earn the least at £14.72.

The figures, based on the company's internal payroll records for the tax year 2022/23, are calculated for live-out nannies working full time, 50 hours per week, before tax. Outside of London and its suburbs, nannies across the rest of the UK earn £35,984 per year, equivalent to £2,999 per month, up 11% on the previous tax year.

One reason for rising salaries is the reduction in childcare places. Official figures from Ofsted show the number of childcare providers, including nurseries and childminders, fell by 4,800 in the year to the end of March 2023, while the number of childcare places fell by 24,500.

In a Nannytax survey of 639 parents who currently hire nannies, 9% said their decision to do so was influenced by the fact they couldn't secure nursery places for their children. More than half (57%) said they needed wraparound care to cover school runs, teatime or bath time, 50% worked long hours, and 18% worked unusual shift patterns. Kirsty Wild, a nanny employment expert at Nannytax, says: "Although full-time nannies are expensive, we know most families (55%) are only using nannies part time, to cover childcare gaps and enable them to carry on working.

"We think the Government could be doing far more to help hardworking families cover nanny costs and help more women return to work. The Chancellor announced in March that every child from nine months old in an eligible working family would be entitled to 30 hours of free childcare by September 2025, and yet this doesn't include childcare offered by nannies. That's nonsensical given the clear need for care outside of nurseries' and childminders' operating hours. We'd like to see the Government make 30 hours free childcare more flexible by including nannies."

Transferring the real life story of a young girl called Erin to fiction, this new book shares how a bespoke communication system, and her mouse, becomes the conduit for Erin accessing the world, whilst providing family, friends and others with the chance to speak with Erin and her embrace her joie de vivre.

With cerebral palsy limiting Erin's only means of communication to eye movement, these uplifting stories burst with positive messages of never giving up and acceptance of oneself.

A great read and one that is destined to become a bedtime favourite for all youngsters,

congratulations must go to the author for bringing Erin's story to the fore, and to the real Erin for agreeing to share her story, vitality and sense of fun.

All profits from sales of this book will go to SpecialEffect, the charity that built the communication system for Erin.

The story

Just as the heroine in these stories, in real life Erin is a young girl who cannot walk, talk or use her hands. She has cerebral palsy and her only reliable movement is her eyes.

Each of the scenarios were experienced by Erin and author Clare Latham – from Erin writing with her eyes and finding the print button, to playing the recorder, to hosting her own reading club and to her wonderful peer group who effortlessly watched her eyes and heard her stories.

Included in these tales are subtle messages for her and many others such as 'never give up', 'I am able just as I am', 'reading gives one so much' and 'accept me as me'.

Clare Latham was asked by SpecialEffect founder Dr Mick Donegan if she could build a communication system with Erin, which she did together with her Mum and personal assistant. Erin's tenacity, ability and sense of fun then spurred Clare to write these stories from their shared experiences and, as it were, keep her going.

Clare Latham is a retired speech and language therapist, and lives in the UK. The author says: "With 17 million around the world living with cerebral palsy*, my stories are dedicated to all children who cannot speak. You can communicate, I believe in you and we need to hear YOUR stories. We need to learn from you.

"SpecialEffect is the charity who discovered Erin. It is dedicated to giving disabled people the technology to access video games and the internet, thus promoting fun and inclusion. Dr Donegan was awarded an MBE for his service to disability."
